The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement



- the world's largest humanitarian network.
- made up of over 11,672,900 members, volunteers and supporters in 191 National Societies. It has three main components:
- a) The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC)
- b) The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC)
- c) 191 member Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies
- The Movement also works in cooperation with governments, donors and other local and international aid organizations to assist vulnerable people around the world.
- The ICRC, IFRC and the National Societies are independent bodies. Each has its own individual status and exercises no authority over the others.

The Manila Declaration Engage Local Humanitarian Action in a Fast-Changing World

We, the leaders of the National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies of the Asia Pacific region, gathered in Manila for the 10th Asia Pacific Regional Conference, from 11 to 14 November 2018,

Recalling and building on the Beijing Call for Innovation adopted at the 9th Asia Pacific Regional Conference in 2014.

Recalling and building on the Baghdad Declaration of 2018.

Recalling Resolution 1 acopted by the Council of Delegates in 2017 concerning Strengthening Movement Coordination and Cooperation (SMCC).

Endorsing the Manila Youth Commitments 2018, "#YouthAfTheCentre"

Asserting a vision and commitment by 2030 of a culture of volunteering, a culture of prevention, and a culture of engagement and collaboration.

Commit collectively and individually to implement the Manila Call to Engage Local Humanitarian Action in a Fast-Changing World of the 10th Asia Pacific Conference.

Rationale for Engage Local Humanitarian Action in a Fast-Changing World

Asia Pacific stretches from the eastern shores of the Mediterranean Sea to the furthest outreaches of the Pacific Ocean and is hore to almost two-thirds of the world's population. It is a dynamic, diverse and fastchanging region with strong economic growth. The region drives global innovation and opportunities. At the same time, the region is prone to catastrophic disasters, due to extreme weather events, earthquakes and volcanic eruptions. The davastating impacts of climate change are a reality across the region and projected to be an increasing threat. The region is also affected by some of the world's most complex and protracted conflicts. These disasters and crises

destroy lives and livelihoods, and lead to millions of people leaving their homes as migrants and refugees. Health is a major concern across the region, with high risk and prevalence of non-communicable diseases and epidemics.

In today's world, trust constitutes one of the most important assets for organizations to obtain the support required for any work in society. For humanitarian institutions, this represents the most important condition to guarantee the access to the most vulnerable people in the world independently of their status and living conditions, and for the Red Cross and Red Crescent to accomplish its humanitarian mandate. To foster this trust, we must ensure that we reflect the diversity of our communities. This requires an active and diverse participation, and representation of youth, women and people with disabilities.

We commit, collectively and individually, to implement the following recommendations of the 10th Asia Pacific conference under the theme of "Engage Local Humanitarian Action in a Fast-Changing World":

Women's Leadership

We are committed to achieve greater female representation at the leadership and governance levels, both at the international and National Society levels.



A school bus mounted a pavement at Cheung Hong Street in North Point on 10 December 2018 that left 4 dead and 11 injured.


Cheung Tsing Traffic Accident in November 2018


